

PETITION to the House of Commons in Parliament Assembled

JUSTICE FOR AN ABORIGINAL MAN WRONGLY CONVICTED

Whereas John Moore was accused and convicted of second degree murder in a case where the crown agreed he was nowhere near the scene of the crime, and where a trial determined he played no part in planning the crime.

Whereas, an aboriginal man, John Moore was convicted in Sault Ste Marie in 1979 by an all-white jury, which resulted in a 10 years of prison and a lifetime on parole.

Whereas the law used to convict John Moore was later declared unconstitutional.

WE THE UNDERSIGNED call on the Honourable Robert Nicholson, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, to: Review the conviction in the case of R. vs John Moore, recognize that a wrongful conviction occurred, and overturn the conviction and enter an acquittal
